CHOLERA, -Several fatal cases have Aug. 3 occurred at Columbus, Ohio

CINCINNATI .- A letter in the Richmond Compiler, dated Cincinnati. July 19. says-The Cholera is still pretty bad in this place-probably four or five deathe per day. The cases seem likewise to be more obstinate and fatal than they have before been this season.
